How to Use This Toolkit

This toolkit is designed to support coalitions at all stages of development in building strong, sustainable infrastructure. It provides practical tools and guidance to strengthen governance, clarify roles, and align coalition efforts around shared goals.

Coalitions may be in different phases of development—whether just forming, growing, or refining their work. This toolkit is intended to meet coalitions where they are and provide support along the way.

A Flexible Approach

The components in this toolkit are all essential to a strong coalition. Coalitions may begin with any section based on their current needs, capacity, and priorities. Over time, all areas should be addressed to ensure a well-rounded and sustainable infrastructure.

Shared Responsibility

Strong coalitions rely on shared leadership and active participation from members across sectors. Responsibilities should be distributed across coalition members, committees, and partners to build ownership, strengthen engagement, and support long-term success. This work is not intended to be completed by one individual.

This toolkit is organized into key areas of coalition infrastructure. Each area plays a critical role in building and sustaining an effective coalition:

- **Vision & Mission** - Establishes a shared purpose and direction to guide coalition efforts.
- **Roles & Leadership** - Clarifies responsibilities, supports leadership development, and promotes shared ownership.
- **Bylaws & Structure** - Defines governance, membership, and decision-making processes for long-term sustainability.
- **Policies** - Ensures ethical practices, financial accountability, and consistent operations.

Putting It Into Practice

Coalitions are encouraged to use these tools in a way that is practical and relevant to their work. Documents should be reviewed regularly, adapted as needed, and integrated into daily operations.

Update: If community needs shift or strategic priorities change.



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☐ ROLES, RESPONSIBILITIES & LEADERSHIP

CLARIFY EXPECTATIONS FOR COALITION LEADERS, MEMBERS, AND STAFF

A strong coalition needs clear leadership and fully informed members.

Use these tools to:

- Clarify staff and volunteer roles.
- Define expectations for officers, coordinators, committees, and members.
- Support leadership development and succession planning.

Review: Annually or during onboarding of new members or leaders.

Update: When leadership or staffing roles shift, committee or member engagement changes, roles are unclear, or responsibilities are not being fulfilled.



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BYLAWS & STRUCTURE

ESTABLISH AND UPDATE COALITION STRUCTURE AND DECISION-MAKING

Move into defining your coalition's structure, membership criteria, officers, committees, and processes.

Use these tools to:

- Update or create bylaws.
- Ensure your coalition is structured for sustainability.
- Prepare for further formalization if desired (e.g., 501(c)(3) status).

Review: Every 1–2 years.

Update: When membership structure, leadership roles, or governance changes; voting or decision-making procedures change; or coalition is formalizing (e.g., 501(c)(3)).



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POLICIES

ENSURE ETHICAL, FINANCIAL, AND STRUCTURAL ACCOUNTABILITY

Begin by reviewing your coalition's foundational policies to ensure ethical, transparent, and effective operations.

Use these tools to:

- Identify gaps in existing policies.
- Adapt foundational documents to fit your coalition.
- Establish consistent procedures for decision-making and financial management.

Review: Annually.

Update: When funding requirements change, financial processes are updated, compliance issues arise, or policies no longer reflect current practices or requirements.

Once you've completed the toolkit, use this guide to move from planning to action.

Bring your coalition together to:

- Review newly developed or updated documents.
- Formally approve or adopt changes.
- Identify training, onboarding, or capacity-building needs.
- Integrate finalized documents into onboarding materials, websites, and coalition systems.
