1. Who We Heard From

Survey Participants: 87 respondents

Roles & Connections to Families: Child Abuse and Neglect/Child Welfare 16.46%, Coalition/Network/Group Parent 17.72%, Early Childhood Education 30.38%, Elementary/Secondary School 8.86%, Healthcare Provider 2.53%, Parent/Caregiver 30.38%, Local Health Department 5.06%, Mental Health Provider 3.80%, Parenting Education 35.44%, Parent Leader 10.13%, PIHP - Prepaid Inpatient Health Plan 1.27%, State Department 2.53%, Substance Use Prevention Provider 12.66%, Substance Use Treatment Provider 2.53%, Volunteer 3.80%
