120% More Deaths Nationwide

The opioid overdose epidemic is one of the most pressing issues in the United States. Between 2010 and 2018, the number of people dying from opioid overdose in the U.S. increased by 120 percent, according to the World Health Organization.

2,036 Deaths in Michigan

In 2018, of the 2,599 deaths from drug overdoses, 2,036 deaths were opioid-related. More people died from overdose deaths than car crashes that year (Source: Michigan Opioid Epidemic by the Numbers).

5 Deaths a Day in Michigan

Approximately five Michiganders die every day due to opioid overdoses, according to the <u>State of Michigan</u>.

20 Percent

The opioid overdose mortality rate for white residents decreased by 5 percent from 2017 to 2018, yet overdose mortality rates among Black residents increased by 20 percent, according to data from the State of Michigan

Addicted Michigan: Narcan kits help fight back against the rise in fentanyl abuse.

Anyone can and should administer this nasal spray if they suspect any overdose. If no opioids were involved, Narcan would not harm the person and won't have any effect. Since we know that many substances are now

mixed with fentanyl, often without the user's knowledge, it is even more important that people don't use it alone and have someone nearby who carries Narcan.

What are Syringe Services Programs (SSPs)?

Syringe Services Programs, often called SSPs, are community-based prevention programs. SSPs provide a range of health services, and they provide a lifeline to those struggling with substance abuse. Comprehensive SSPs offer patients vaccinations and testing for diseases, referrals to treatment for substance use disorder and other diseases (such as viral hepatitis and HIV), and sterile injection equipment to prevent the transmission of infectious diseases.

Scientists, including those at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), have studied SSPs for more than 30 years and found that comprehensive SSPs benefit communities.
